# Tour Stop One Toledo Shipyard

The Toledo Shipyard has been an important part of Lincoln County for more than 150 years. The Port of Toledo encompasses 443 square miles, including the cities of Toledo and Siletz, as well as a large area of unincorporated Lincoln County with facilities located along the Yaquina River. The Port offers a wide variety of services to develop, promote, and sustain the economic base of the area, including the Port of Toledo Shipyard, industrial leases, as well as recreational facilities.

When you see a ship, you may think of it at sea; but there are many aspects of stewardship and economic impact associated with the industry that you may not know about. At the Port of Toledo, hundreds of ships sail in and out loaded with an array of cargo bringing money to the region. To support this, a bulk of the work done at the Port of Toledo is repair on freighters, barges, tankers and tugs that come to the dock for repair work; providing jobs for thousands of people in our area.

The forestry stop is at Pioneer Bear, a site managed by Weyerhaeuser. At Pioneer Bear, we will focus on two aspects of the site. First, you will be shown different aged forests under different ownership, and second you will witness a cable logging job.

## Different Aged Forests

- View a diversity of forest ownership and managing resulting in different outcomes (USFS, BLM, ODF, Large Industrial Ownership, Small Woodland Ownership)
- “Ages and stages” of forest provide for diverse ecological habitats and support different species of vegetation, animals, birds, etc.
- The Oregon Forest Practices Act – there are laws in place that ensure forest are managed properly, these laws are continuously reviewed and adjusted with input from all parties.
- Mother Nature has provided natural disturbance in the forest through fires, windstorms, ice storms, drought, insects, disease, etc. Clearcut harvest mimics this natural disturbance and provides Douglas Fir the perfect environment which it needs to survive and grow.
- Wood is Good! Recyclable and Renewable. It is truly a sustainable resource we will have forever.

### **Message from Anna**

We feel very blessed to have the opportunity to live and work as a family on this “little piece of paradise”. I have been raising show quality, registered Nigerian dairy goats for 20 years. Six years ago, I established a small herd of premium quality, registered, Kunekune pigs. Although I seek to have animals of show quality, production from the goats (creamy milk) and pigs (pasture raised pork) is essential. Both Nigerians and Kunekunes are perfect breeds for small farm and homestead situations. In addition, our “petite paradise” is home to a llama, fourteen alpacas, eight Shetland sheep, a dozen laying hens and 14 Orpington chicks, ten tiny Serama chickens and 20 of their chicks, eighteen Muscovy ducks plus ducklings, four livestock guardian dogs, about a dozen rabbits of various breeds, seven barn cats, and three Pomeranian farm dogs.
